## LIEUTENANT COLONEL JOHN R. SCOTT

Lt Col John "Clench" Scott is the Commander, Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps (AFROTC) Detachment 915, West Virginia University (WVU), Morgantown, West Virginia. He commands a diverse unit of officer, enlisted, and a university employee to recruit, train, and develop officers for the United States Air Force and United States Space Force. His cadet corps consists of 79 cadets, the sixth largest detachment in the Northeast Region. He holds the title of full professor and Department Chair of Aerospace Studies at WVU.

Lt Col Scott previously served as the 80th Operations Support Squadron Commander at Sheppard AFB, TX, leading a squadron of 550 personnel that maintained the busiest joint-use airfield and airspace in the command while managing all student pilots in the Euro-NATO Joint Jet Pilot Training program, including fourteen NATO nations.

Lt Col Scott commissioned in Aug 2003 after graduating from The Ohio State University. In 2005, he earned his pilot wings from Joint Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training, Vance Air Force Base, Oklahoma. In his previous assignments Lt Col Scott served as Flight Commander, 560th Flying Training Squadron, Chief of



Squadron Scheduling, 37th Bomb Squadron, Ellsworth AFB and Executive Officer, 12 Operations Group, Randolph AFB. He is a graduate of the Army Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas and Air War College by correspondence.

Lt Col Scott is a command pilot with more than 3,100 flying hours, including 564 combat hours in the B-1, T-37, T-6, and T-38C. His combat experience includes Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation New Dawn. Previously, Lt Col Scott served as the Military Deputy Chief of the Air Force's Global Precision Attack (GPA) Core Function Team, Langley, Virginia. In this capacity, he led fiscal Planning and Programming for the Air Force's largest combat portfolio including the A-10, F-15E, F-16, and F-35 weapon systems.
